2020 YEAR 4 INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC PROGRAMME

In Year 4, all students at Coomera Anglican College experience the joy of learning a band or orchestral instrument as part of their Music education. This is compulsory, free of charge and enables all students to participate in small group lessons. Later in the year, they become part of a class band or orchestra. As part of the programme, students will be given a College instrument to play. Lessons are held weekly with our instrumental tutors in a rotating timetable.

Early in Term One, Year 4 students will have the opportunity to nominate three instruments which they may like to learn. They then go through a simple trial process to confirm their suitability. Such things as body size, mouth structure and ability to hold and transport large instruments are considered. The process will involve matching the right students for each instrument available at the College. Please be aware that there are limited numbers of some instruments, and the class ensemble balance will be considered when allocations are made.

The instruments available for selection include: Flute, Oboe, Bassoon, Clarinet, Alto Saxophone, Trumpet, French Horn, Baritone, Trombone, Percussion, Violin, Viola, Cello and Double Bass. I would advise you to discuss which instruments your child might like to try. At the start of the year, we hold a short concert in which the instrumental tutors demonstrate each instrument and we then begin the selection process. After the students have tried some instruments, a note will be sent home for you to sign and confirm their choices.

Students who currently have instrumental lessons on any of the above instruments may continue with that instrument in paid private lessons as their Year 4 music programme. They may also choose to try an additional instrument as part of the free Year 4 programme. Alternatively, they may continue their current instrument as part of the Year 4 Programme in a special group for advanced students. This mainly applies to String and Fife students.
